1st CALL FOR PAPERS

Oral and poster presentations

Oral presentations may be between 10 and 40 minutes in duration. Presentations in the form of video conference are possible. Posters will preferentially be posted for the full length of the meeting. An abstract of up to 300 words describing the main points and conclusions of the presentation must be provided as soon as possible but before May 15, 2006. Electronic submission will be available.

Discussion workshops, and hands-on experiments demonstrations

Sessions will be scheduled for the discussion of particular topics (women and science, scientific literacy, R&D, Science and Society, ethics, life long learning, informal learning,...) presentation and demonstration of experiments. A short abstract of no more than 500 words (two pages including affiliation and figures) describing the activity must be submitted by May 8, 2006. The experiments may also be presented in the Science Fair.

Science fair and festival

Schools, research institutions, industries, Science clubs, groups of students and or teachers, or individuals may prepare a booth to present their work at the Conference' Science Fair. A short abstract of no more than 500 words (two pages including affiliation and figures) describing the activity must be submitted by May 8, 2006.

A major Socrates/**Comenius Contact Seminar** "*Building bridges* towards an improved Science Education. in EU' Schools." will allow the discussion and preparation of new Comenius 2 and Comenius 1 school projects.

English is the official language of the Conference. However real time translation (French, German, Italian, Portuguese and Spanish), will be available on plenary sessions, keynote presentations and on several workshops and discussion groups. Abstracts received before the 1st deadline in any of the above languages will also be translated into English. As well in what will concern the best manuscripts.
